ANNUAL MEASURE

This document constitutes the annual work programme in the sense of Article 110(2) of the Financial Regulation, and annual and multiannual action plans and measures in the sense of Article 9 of IPA III Regulation and Article 23 of NDICI - Global Europe Regulation.

1.2. Summary of the Action

This measure consists of the annual contribution to be paid as a membership fee in support of the operational budget of the Office of the High Representative (OHR) in Bosnia and Herzegovina from 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023. The budget for the year 2022-2023 was adopted by the PIC Steering Board at Ambassadors' level on June 2022. The specific objective of the membership fee to be provided under this measure is to facilitate the smooth operation of the OHR in Bosnia and Herzegovina from July 2022 to June 2023 while ensuring that the activities of the OHR do not conflict with the tasks and functions of the EU, in particular those of the European Union Special Representative (EUSR) in Bosnia and Herzegovina. This support shall help the OHR – in close cooperation and coordination with the EU – to work on the further completion of its mandate, in particular the fulfilment of the remaining "5+2 objectives and conditions" not yet completed.

2. RATIONALE

2.1. Context

This measure consists of the contribution to be paid as a membership fee pursuant to Article 239 of Regulation (EU, Euratom) No 2018/1046 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 18 July 2018 on the financial rules applicable to the general budget of the Union by the EU as member of the Peace Implementation Council (PIC) in support of the operational budget of the Office of the High Representative (OHR) in Bosnia and Herzegovina from July 2023 to June 2024. The budget for the year 2023-2024 was adopted by the PIC Steering Board at Ambassadors' level in June 2023.

This support shall help the OHR – in close cooperation and coordination with the EU – to work on the further completion of its mandate, in particular the fulfilment of the remaining "5+2 objectives and conditions" not yet completed.

The specific objective of the membership fee to be provided under this measure is to facilitate the smooth operation of the OHR in Bosnia and Herzegovina from July 2023 to June 2024 while ensuring that the

activities of the OHR do not conflict with the tasks and functions of the EU, in particular those of the European Union Special Representative (EUSR) in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

For the budget year 2023/2024, the EU agreed to increase the level of contribution by 6,22% compared to 2022-2023. The EU contribution of EUR 2 563 328 corresponds to 43.79% of the approved OHR budget, which amounts to EUR 5 853 701. In case the contributions of other non-EU PIC members amount to less than the foreseen 54.70% of the approved budget ("weaker sources of funding") the EU contribution may exceed 43.79% of the actual eligible expenditure but in any case, may not be higher than EUR 2 563 328 for the period 2023-2024.

2.2. Problem Analysis

Short problem analysis:

The mandate of the OHR is to oversee all civilian aspects of the implementation of the General Framework Agreement for Peace (GFAP) ¹.

Identification of main stakeholders and corresponding institutional and/or organisational issues (mandates, potential roles, and capacities) to be covered by the action:

The mandate of the OHR is set out in Annex 10 of the GFAP. The PIC, a group of 55 representatives of governments and international organisations which finance and direct the peace implementation process, has subsequently elaborated on his mandate.

It is assumed that the OHR will continue to operate uninterruptedly until 30 June 2024. Should the OHR's mandate come to an end before 30 June 2024, the EU contribution will be reduced *pro rata*.

The EU contribution through the Instrument for Pre-accession Assistance (IPA III) to the OHR budget is paid under the assumption that the OHR ensures full coordination of its activities with the EU in line with the EU policy in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

The EU contribution to the OHR annual budget is paid under the condition that the OHR performs the tasks indicated in the OHR annual budget (as shown in the explanatory notes under each of the relevant sections) agreed by the PIC Steering Board Ambassadors in June 2023.

Failure to comply with the requirements set out above may lead to a recovery of funds under this programme and/or the re-allocation of future funding.

3. IMPLEMENTATION ARRANGEMENTS

This measure shall be implemented by payment of a membership fee to the OHR under direct management by the European Commission in accordance with articles 62(1)(a) and 239 of the Financial Regulation.

The Commission authorises that the costs incurred may be recognised as eligible as of 1 July 2023 prior to the adoption of this Financing Decision as per the bilateral agreement between the Commission and the OHR concerning the EU contributions to the OHR budget for 2023/2024 starting each year on 1 July and ending on 30 June of the following year.

The envisaged assistance to the individual measure in favour of the OHR from July 2023-June 2024 is deemed to follow the conditions and procedures set out by the restrictive measures adopted pursuant to Art. 215 TFEU²

4. PERFORMANCE MEASUREMENT

4.1. Monitoring and Reporting

The day-to-day technical and financial monitoring of the implementation of this action will be a continuous process, and part of the implementing partner's responsibilities. To this aim, the implementing partner shall establish a permanent internal, technical and financial monitoring system for the action and elaborate regular progress reports (not less than annual) and final reports. Every report shall provide an accurate account of implementation of the action, difficulties encountered, changes introduced, as well as the degree of achievement of its results (Outputs and direct Outcomes) as measured by corresponding indicators, using as reference the logframe matrix (for project modality) and the partner's strategy, policy or reform action plan list (for budget support). The Commission may undertake additional project monitoring visits both through its own staff and through independent consultants recruited directly by the Commission for independent monitoring reviews (or recruited by the responsible agent contracted by the Commission for implementing such reviews).

The Commission may undertake any actions it deems necessary to monitor the measure concerned. Apart from standard financial reporting by the OHR to PIC members, specific reporting obligations to the Commission may be agreed in an exchange of letters with the OHR before the first payment is made.
