Objectives

2.1 Overall Objective

Contribution to the nature protection in Bulgaria through the enforcement of Directive 92/43/EEC (Habitats) and Directive 79/409/EEC (Birds).

2.2 Project Purpose

- 1.) A list of proposed sites to constitute the Bulgarian Natura 2000 network legally approved by the Bulgarian Government and submitted to European Commission in accordance with the requirements of EU Directive 92/43 (Habitats) and the EU Directive 79/409 (Birds).
- 2.) Designation and management of special protected areas (\$PAs Birds) developed in line with the provisions of the Directives.

2.3 Accession Partnership (AP) and NPAA priority

The Accession Partnership 2003 identifies the following priorities for environment:

- Continue transposition of the acquis, including secondary legislation, with particular on environmental impact assessment, access to information, waste management, industrial pollution and risk management, nature protection, chemicals and genetically modified organisms, and nuclear safety and radiation protection. Ensure consultation with all relevant stakeholders (other ministries, economic operators, NGOs);
- Continue implementation of the acquis with particular emphasis on access to information, air quality, waste management, water quality, nature protection, industrial pollution and risk management as well as nuclear safety and radiation protection;
- Reinforce staffing of the Ministry and other public bodies. Ensure adequate training and staff development plans.

3. Description

3.1 Background and justification:

Directive 92/43/EEC aims to promote the maintenance of biodiversity in the Member States by defining a common framework for the conservation of wild flora and fauna and habitats of Community interest.

The Directive establishes a European ecological network known as "Natura 2000". The network comprises of "special areas of conservation" designated by Member States in accordance with the provisions of the Directive 92/43/EEC, and special protection areas classified pursuant to Directive 79/409/EEC (conservation of wild birds).

To fulfil the requirements of the two directives, Bulgaria must on accession submit a list of Bulgarian sites to be part of the European Natura 2000 Network, each site described in the Standard Natura 2000 Data Form and with associated maps, pictures and other supporting information.

Furthermore, the proposed Special Protection Areas (SPAs) must be designated by accession *at the latest*, which includes giving all SPAs an appropriate legal protection status.

SPAs management in line with the provisions of the Birds Directive and Art.6 of the Habitats Directive as transposed by the Bulgarian Biodiversity Act require that a management plan preparation process start once they have been designated i.e. from accession onwards.

According to the Bulgarian Biodiversity act, the first steps of the designation process of both types of sites (SPA and PSCI) follow the same procedure (Articles 8, 9 and 10). Thus, in order to be ready for submission of the Natura 2000 list of sites a big amount of technical work is required, so that administrative acceptance of the network is reached.

The schedule for implementation of above-mentioned activities and their relevance to the different types of sites are presented on separate Figure in item 3.4 below.

Major steps in preparing Bulgaria for Natura 2000 have been taken under the DANCEE supported Project "Conservation of Species and Habitats in Bulgaria: EU-Approximation" initiated on the 1st of October 2002. Meanwhile, the average coverage of national Natura 2000 Networks in Member States now cover 18 % of national territories and in states with particularly rich biodiversity the figure is much higher. The DANCEE funded project estimates that the Bulgarian Natura 2000 Network should cover approximately 34 % of Bulgaria's territory.

So far around 500 potential Natura 2000 sites were identified till December 2004. For 129 of them ecological information required for Natura 2000 Standard Data Form is fully or partly collected.

The distribution of the different types of sites is:

- Special Protection Areas (SPAs) in accordance with the Birds Directive, covering around 23% of the Bulgarian territory;
- proposed Sites of Community Importance (pSCI) in accordance with the Habitats Directive, covering around 29% of the Bulgarian territory.

SPAs and pSCIs overlap on around 19% of Bulgaria's territory.

There is need of significant amount of fieldwork to be accomplished in terms of describing and presenting to EC information in the required format. There are several projects with different scope and duration starting at the beginning of 2005 in order to cover this need. They are presented and summarized in item 3.5 *Linked Activities* of the present fiche. So far MoEW is ready to perform its duty until accession date (January 2007).

The National Nature Protection Service (NNPS) of Ministry of Environment and Water (MoEW) is the Bulgarian governmental body charged with the responsibility of preparing Bulgaria for compliance with the requirements of EU Habitats and Birds Directives. However, as far back as in 2000 the NNPS acknowledged that it does not have the capacity to manage the Natura 2000 preparation process. Most notably, the NNPS lacks the human and financial resources to staff and finance a Natura 2000 Secretariat to manage and co-ordinate field inventory work and to compile and analyse biodiversity and spatial data in the National Natura 2000 GIS / Database. At the present moment these activities are more or less undertaken by the above-mentioned projects and mainly by the two major projects financed by the Enterprise for Management of Environmental Protection Activities (EMEPA), MoEW and implemented by Green Balkans - Federation of Nature Conservation NGOs and Bulgarian Society for the Protection of Birds, respectively.

Still there are a lot more essential for the establishment of Natura 2000 network in Bulgaria activities remaining uncovered by the ongoing projects. They are mainly in the field of information dissemination (considered to be quite insufficient and even neglected till the present moment) and implementation of the national legislation (considering mainly the Bulgarian Biodiversity Act) in its turn transposing the requirements of the two EU Directives, particularly the preparation of the needed documentation; organising public hearings; accomplishment of the relevant designation procedures and the subsequent management of designated sites. Further external support is therefore required and the NNPS developed the idea of a PHARE funded project to assist it with preparation for Natura 2000.

The form of the Natura 2000 information submitted to the European Commission (maps in scale 1: 100 000) is not enough detailed for clarifying the exact boundaries and the "affected" stakeholders. The base map (Ownership and Land use map) that has been administratively accepted in Bulgaria is in scale 1: 5 000. All of the administrations (state, regional, municipal, forest) work with this map. The presenting of the boundaries of the potential Natura 2000 sites in a different than the accepted format would be apprehended as not a serious attitude on the behalf of MoEW and it could have negative effect on the public hearings as well as on the whole process.

This is why a large amount of technical work needs to be completed in which almost all 263 Municipal offices "Agriculture and Forestry" will be involved.

Lack of general dissemination of information to all stakeholders, as well as establishment of a negotiation methodology with the landowners and possessors, also was identified as a weak point of

the current developments in the nature protection sector, which need to be resolved as soon as possible.

In accordance with the recommendations within Peer Review report (23 -25 June 2004) the PHARE project will focus on the strengthening of the administrative capacity on central, regional and local level on the enforcement and implementation of the Directives requirements, as well as on designation and management of the proposed Natura 2000 sites.

In order to meet Bulgaria's obligations under the Birds Directive and Article 6 of the Habitat Directive as transposed in the Bulgarian Biodiversity Act, preparation of management plans for all designated sites is required. However, in view of the accession process time-scale and the envisaged duration of this project it will focus primarily on the preparation of management plans for the SPAs.

3.3 Results

3.3.1. Purpose

The Project Purpose can be summarized as follows:

- A list of proposed sites to constitute the Bulgarian Natura 2000 network legally approved by the Bulgarian Government and submitted to European Commission in accordance with the requirements of EU Directive 92/43 (Habitats) and the EU Directive 79/409 (Birds).
- Designation and management of special protected areas (SPAs Birds) developed in line with the provisions of the Directives.

3.3.2. Results

The Project Purpose will be pursued by delivering the following Project Results:

- 1. Documentation required under national legislation for all of the proposed Natura 2000 sites prior to their submission to European Commission in line with Art. 4 of EU Directive 92/43 (Habitats) prepared.
- 2. Methodology for negotiation with landowners and possessors of the land developed.
- 3. Public hearings with the participation of representatives of the ministries and central-government departments concerned, of the competent administrative regional administrations and municipalities, research and academic institutes, ecologist and public organizations carried out.
- 4. Accomplished site designation procedure in line with Art.12 of the Biodiversity Act for all SPAs (sites under the Birds Directive only).
- 5. Management plans for priority SPAs endorsed.

- 6. Administrative capacity on central, regional, and local level trained on the enforcement and implementation of the Directives requirements, as well as on the management of the proposed Natura 2000 sites and identification of the new ones.
- 7. Information on NATURA 2000 network- disseminated to all the stakeholders.

3.4 Activities

The sections below describe the key activities required to deliver each of the project Results:

1. Preparation of the documentation required under Art.8 of the Biodiversity Act for all of the proposed Natura 2000 sites (both SPAs and pSCIs).

During ecological investigations, large amount of information required by this paragraph was already collected such as purpose, SDF, and maps. Now the aim is to collect missing "technical" information:

- ➤ Work on administrative appliance of Natura 2000 in Bulgaria activities to "translate" and "visualise" EU requirements to the day-to-day administrative level of Municipalities, Forestry Units etc. Verification and adjustment of the boundaries of potential Natura 2000 sites (in scale 1:100 000) and national cadastre (in scale1: 5 000).
- Assistance in the Assignment of land use and area distribution of forests, land tracts and aquatic areas for each proposed site.
- 2. Implementing the legal procedures for both SPAs and pSCIs stated with Art.9 and 10 of the Biodiversity Act.
 - ➤ Development of methodology for negotiation with landowners and possessors of the land on the basis of the Member States best practises issuance of guidelines, workshops for the state officials and stakeholders involved, etc. Prepare answers to frequently asked question in relation with restrictions, compensations etc.
 - ➤ Preparation of materials to be discussed during the public hearings and distributed among the participants.
 - Assistance in the Conducting of public hearings with the participation of representatives of the ministries and central-government departments concerned, of the competent administrative regional administrations and municipalities, research and academic institutes, ecologist and public organizations in accordance with Art. 9 of the Biodiversity Act.
 - Assistance in the Preparation for submission of collected documentation for Natura 2000 list of sites (including the Minutes from the public hearings) to the National Biodiversity Council for discussions in accordance with Art. 10 of the Biodiversity
- 3. Designation of SPAs (sites under the Birds Directive only) in line with Art.12 of the Biodiversity Act.


Preparation of draft text for the Official Designation Orders – arguments for designation, purpose, total area and distribution of land use, geographical coordinates of the site boundaries, description of all plot's numbers included within the site boundary, restrictions on certain activities.

4. elaboration of management plans for priority SPAs

Ramsar sites and Important Bird Areas are to be considered as priority SPAs.

- Preparation of draft management plans containing a general description of the protected zone and of the components thereof; the management objectives in the protected zone; the standards, regimes, conditions or recommendations for the performance of: activities in the forests, land tracts and aquatic areas; development of infrastructure and construction; organization of management and other activities ensuring attainment of the objectives as set; short-term and long-term action programmes associated with scientific research and monitoring of the environmental media, maintenance of endangered species, communities and habitats, environmental awareness and education, etc.
- Assistance in the Conducting of public discussions of the draft management plans where required by the national legislation.
- Assistance in the Submission for adoption of draft management plans to the Ministry of Environment and Water with the terms of reference, minutes of proceedings at the public discussions; summaries of any unincorporated remarks set forth at the public discussions, and any objections and observations of the MoEW on any such remarks, reports on scientific researches and studies conducted in the process of elaboration of the drafts and consolidated results of seminars, informal working meetings and other forms of participation of the public and state bodies concerned in the process of elaboration of management plans, attached.
- 5. Training of relevant state regional and local officials on the enforcement and implementation of the EU Directives requirements, as well as of management of the proposed Natura 2000 sites and identification of the new ones workshops, seminars, issuance of manuals/guidelines;
- 6. Dissemination of information through media, short films, lectures, printed materials on Natura 2000 network:

A key activity is to establish a database at the Environmental Executive Agency for biodiversity monitoring. This database should be compatible with the MoEW Natura 2000 GIS / Database and so some future co-ordination is foreseen.

3.6 Lessons learned

The lessons listed below are those learned during the development and implementation of the DANCEE supported project:

MoEW/NNPS:

The DANCEE Supported Project was implemented in collaboration with the NNPS under MoEW The interaction and collaboration between the counterparts is crucial to the development of the planned activities.

Involvement of NGOs and Scientists:

Bulgarian NGOs and Scientists have been deeply involved in the DANCEE Supported Natura 2000 Project, right from the start of developing the Project to the time of implementation. Although it has often been difficult to reach consensus, the high interest in Natura 2000 and in the Project is viewed as positive, as the NGO and scientist participation insures that findings are subject to a wide public discussion and scrutiny.

Information Sharing and Co-ordination:

It is observed that projects, NGOs, scientist and other parties in Bulgaria tend to see data and information as something to hold onto rather than sharing with others. Collection of data therefore becomes cumbersome and occasionally different projects carry out overlapping activities and surveys because of lack of co-ordination and sharing of information.

4. Institutional Framework

The Ministry of the Environment and Waters (MoEW) is the responsible authority for the enforcement of the legislation.

The National Nature Protection Service within the Ministry for Environment and Water will be in charge with the co-ordination, the leading and monitoring of the implementation process on nature protection legislation.

A Project Steering Committee will be established to:

- Monitor project implementation by *reading and discussing* Project Inception Reports, Progress Reports and Completion Report;
- *Provide recommendations* to the Ministry of Environment and Water on project progress, approval of Project Reports, and any other matter of relevance to the project;
- Provide guidance to the Management Team of the MoEW Natura 2000 secretariat as required.

Representatives from the following groups should be members of the PSC:

- Ministry of Environment and Water (Chair);
- Ministry of Agriculture and Forests;
- Ministry of Regional Development and Public Works;
- Bulgarian Academy of Science;
- NGOs representatives;

A Management Team of the MoEW Natura 2000 Secretariat, *responsible for project implementation*, will be established. A Technical Advisory Network will advise the MoEW Natura 2000 Secretariat on technical and scientific issues related to Natura 2000 preparations, most notably related to results of field inventories and selection of sites to be included in the Bulgarian Natura 2000 network.
