2. Objectives

2.1. Overall Objectives:

Support to Neighbourhood Programme implementation for the achievement of its objectives and priorities and preparing future neighbourhood and cross-border programmes.

2.2. Project purpose

To provide a smooth administration of the Phare/CARDS Neighbourhood Programme between Bulgaria and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia and to support the relevant authorities and bodies in preparation of the neighbourhood and cross-border programmes 2007-2013.

2.3. Accession Partnership (AP) and NPAA priority

This support helps to adopt the *acquis* and strengthen the institutions necessary for implementing and enforcing the *acquis*. It also helps Bulgaria to develop the mechanisms and institutions that will be needed to implement EU Structural Funds after accession and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia to fully develop the mechanisms and institutions needed to implement the IPA..

2.5. Cross-border impact

In the framework of this Neighbourhood Programme one horizontal measure for technical assistance will support Programme implementation and the achievement of its objectives and priorities.

Technical assistance will be used to ensure efficient, effective and transparent management and implementation of the Neighbourhood Programme. The smooth administration of the programme, that joins funds from two different EC sources – Phare CBC and CARDS - and national co-financing, strictly depends on the capacity in management and in properly dealing with procedures in order to prevent and avoid bottlenecks. In addition, this project is expected to contribute to a more efficient transition from Phare CBC/CARDS instruments to Structural Funds and the new Instrument for Pre- Accession (IPA).

The activities are broadly divided into two categories:

- I. Operational costs to the Programme including
 Programme management and implementation
 Projects preparation, programme publicity and evaluation
- II. TA to future Programme preparation

3. Description

3.1. <u>Background and justification</u>

The Joint Programming Document (JPD) is the basis for the Neighbourhood Programme of the border area between the Republic of Bulgaria and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia. As such, this JPD lays the basis for implementing funds both from the EU Phare CBC programme (for Bulgaria) and from the EU CARDS programme (for the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia). Moreover, the document provides a strategic framework for interventions to be financed from the new neighbourhood instrument, which will be established after 2007.

The programme is structured into two main priority axes, supplemented by an additional one for the enhancement of local people to people actions. The NP strategy has in addition a horizontal measure for technical assistance at programme level.

The Neighbourhood Programme operates through an Phare Programme Implementing Agency (fulfilling the role of Contracting Authority) for the Phare CBC component (in Bulgaria) and a Programme Coordination Unit (PCU) for the CARDS component (in the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia), while the Contracting Authority will be the European Agency for Reconstruction (EAR) in the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia.

The management structures for this NP include the national authorities responsible for Programme coordination (Phare Programme Implementing Agency in Bulgaria, and Programme Coordination Unit in the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia), a Joint Cooperation Committee and a Joint Steering Committee, assisted by a Joint Technical Secretariat

The operational costs of the Joint Technical Secretariat are co-financed under the programme's budget provided they comply with the list of tasks eligible for co-financing in the relevant EU regulations.

- Improved administrative activities related to the joint evaluation, monitoring and control process,
- Ready to finance project proposals,
- Programming Documents for 2007-2013 CBC between Bulgaria and the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia prepared,
- Established framework of the new managing structures

3.4. Activities

- The TA will also provide support to future managing structures and potential beneficiaries in the whole cycle of project preparation and implementation for the period 2007-2013

3.6. Lessons learned

The project is a direct product of lessons learned from previous Phare programmes, that is to say the necessity to develop sufficient and adequate planning and preparatory activities to anticipate and minimise problems in the implementation phase.

In the Interim Evaluation of the EU Pre-Accession Instrument Phare of 01 August 2005 it was stated that the relevance of the TA projects under FM 2003 (modified) and FM 2004 is satisfactory.

The JTS office in Kyustendil is almost fully equipped and is actually ready to start operating. The Bulgarian JTS staff (2 employees) is already appointed and the Macedonian JTS staff (1 employee) will shortly be appointed.

4. Institutional Framework

On the Bulgarian side, the responsibilities for Phare-CBC Programme/CARDS Neighbourhood Programme are laid down with the Phare Programme Implementing Agency at the **Ministry of Regional Development and Public Works**. It has the overall responsibility for the implementation, as well as the administrative, technical and financial management. MRDPW is obliged also to monitor the physical and financial implementation, Phare and co-financing payments, and report to the EC in regularly reports.

The MRDPW will ensure necessary human resources for the technical management of the project.

On the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia side, the responsibilities on the day-to-day tasks of the NP lay down with the PCU, while the **European Agency for Reconstruction** (**EAR**) will act as Contracting Authority.

The Joint Technical Secretariat will assist the Bulgarian MRDPW (IA and CBC Programming Department) and the Macedonian PCU in the implementation of the Neighbourhood Programme 2004-2006 and in preparation of the new 2007-2013 cross-border programme.

The above provisions are valid until Bulgaria becomes a member of the European Union. After accession, the national procurement legislation will be in force.
