COMMISSION DECISION

on a Special Measure (part III) for the ENPI 2010 in favour of West Bank and Gaza Strip to be financed under Article 19 08 01 02 of the general budget of the European Union

THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to European Parliament and Council Regulation (EC) No 1638/2006 of 24 October 2006 laying down the general provisions establishing a European Neighbourhood and Partnership Instrument (ENPI) and in particular Article 13(2) thereof,

Whereas:

- (1) Since 2002 the Commission has set priorities for co-operation with West Bank and Gaza Strip on an ad hoc basis and Article 13 of Regulation (EC) n° 1638/2006 provides for the adoption of special measures in the event of unforeseen and duly justified needs or circumstances. Given the difficult situation within the West Bank and Gaza, no strategy paper or multi-annual indicative programme has been established covering 2010.
- (2) The criteria set out in Regulation (EC) n° 1638/2006 and conditions for the special measure have been fulfilled. West Bank and Gaza Strip continues to be in a crisis situation, further aggravated by the conflict in Gaza in December 2008 and January 2009 and by the lack of progress both at the intra-Palestinian and Israeli-Palestinian negotiations.
- (3) The General Affairs and External Relations Council of 10 December 2007 stated that "The Paris Donors' conference in December will be an important opportunity for the whole international community to back up its commitment to assist in the economic and financial development of a future viable Palestinian State and to provide the necessary support to the post- Annapolis process. In this context, the EU looks forward to the Palestinian Reform and Development Plan".
- (4) The General Affairs and External Relations Council of 28 January 2008 stated that "The EU is committed to providing substantial financial support for the Palestinian people, and welcomes the work of the Commission to launch a new funding mechanism PEGASE, which will constitute a key channel for EU and other international assistance".

- (5) The present Decision constitutes a Financing Decision within the meaning of Article 75 of Council Regulation (EC, Euratom) No 1605/2002 of 25 June 2002 on the Financial Regulation applicable to the general budget¹ (hereafter 'the Financial Regulation') and Article 90 of Commission Regulation (EC, Euratom) No 2342/2002 of 23 December 2002 laying down detailed rules for the implementation of the Financial Regulation applicable to the general budget² (hereafter 'the Implementing Rules').
- (6) The maximum contribution of the European Union set by the present decision should cover any possible claims for interest due for late payment on the basis of articles 83 of the Financial Regulation and 106(5) of its Implementing Rules.
- (7) The Commission is required to define the term "substantial change" in the meaning of Article 90 (4) of the Implementing Rules to ensure that any substantial change in this decision shall follow the same procedure as the initial decision.
- (8) The Budgetary Authority has adopted the concurrent transfer proposal DEC35 2010 of €40 million from the Emergency Assistance Reserve.
- (9) The special measure provided for in this Decision is in accordance with the opinion of the ENPI Committee set up under Article 26 of Regulation (EC) No 1638/2006,

HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

Article 1

The special measure for the ENPI in favour of West Bank and Gaza Strip constituted by the action "PEGASE: Additional Support for Recurrent Expenditures of the Palestinian Authority (PA)" (EUR 41.4 million) and "Additional Contribution to UNRWA's 2010 Regular Budget" (EUR 20 million), the text of which is set out in the Annex, is approved.

Article 2

The maximum contribution of the Union to the special measure for the ENPI in favour of West Bank and Gaza Strip is set at EUR 61 400 000 to be financed within the limits of the available resources of budget Article 19 08 01 02 of the general budget of the European Union for 2010.

This maximum contribution shall also cover any possible interests due for late payment.

Article 3

Cumulated changes of the allocations to the specific actions not exceeding 20% of the maximum contribution of the European Union shall not be considered substantial, provided that they do not significantly affect the nature and objectives of the special measure.

The authorising officer by delegation may amend the present Decision to introduce non substantial changes to the special measure in accordance with the principles of sound financial management.
