The EU reacted fast and responded to the urgent needs of Azerbaijan and its citizens. As part of Team Europe, the EU mobilised a tailor-made COVID-19 response package of almost €32 million to support immediate needs and socio-economic recovery. These funds helped to provide targeted assistance to the Azerbaijan's public health system, including 20 hospitals and 5 primary healthcare facilities as well as provisioning essential medical supplies for patient care. The EU also supported the training of more than 2,900 health care workers, 98 laboratory technicians, 1,400 medical and nursing students and other health professionals, including in such areas as mental health and psychosocial support, infection prevention and public hygiene. Azerbaijan receives vaccines through the COVAX Facility, supported by Team Europe with over €3 billion, and bilaterally from EU Member States.
