### WHAT IS BEING DONE

- NEW AND IMPROVED LEGISLATION
   Adopting and applying anti-discrimination
   and domestic violence laws
- MORE WOMEN IN BUSINESS

  Making loans via local banks available for women-led enterprises: medium and large-sized businesses have access to loans through the National Fund of Assistance to Entrepreneurship; although the Fund does not have quotas for women-led businesses, it attempts to attract female clients by offering them favourable terms

**WOMEN IN BUSINESS** 

The EU supports women entrepreneurs in Azerbaijan through the **Women in Business programme**, which is implemented by the European Bank for Reconstruction and Development (EBRD). Support provided by the programme includes **business advice**, **training** and **mentoring** to women-led companies.

**Gulnara Hassanova,** Director of ESSE LLC, a company distributing women's accessories and home-care products, received **EU-funded sales training,** gained **25% more customers** and **increased turnover by 18%.**

# **NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION**

Through its **Erasmus+** programme, the EU offers young women and men in Azerbaijan a huge range of exchange opportunities across Europe.

  Irana Alimova was an Erasmus student in Portugal she now works for an international company in Baku.
- Azerbaijan was provided with €4 million in funding for student and staff exchanges under Erasmus+ in 2015-17, with 876 students and staff from Azerbaijan benefiting from exchanges to EU universities.
- The EU has set a 75% target to support young women under the **EU4Youth** programme that runs until 2020.

# A FAIR SOCIETY

An EU-funded project – **Enabling civil society to play a greater role in advancing gender equality and women's rights** – implemented by the UNDP
has set up women's resource centres in the regions
of Sabirabad, Neftchala and Bilasuvar, which aim at
strengthening women's entrepreneurial skills through
vocational education and creative self-expression.

#### AS A RESULT OF THE PROJECT:

- 4 Women's Resource Centres have opened
- **416 women** have benefited directly, and over 1,500 people indirectly
- over 350 women have received entrepreneurship training
- 50 new women-led businesses were started
- more than 1,300 children, women and men have been reached in awareness-raising campaign on gender-based violence and gender equality
